# 22 - Tonguing

# (Intermediate clarinet - 2nd & 3rd year players)

Review tonguing episodes if needed - Episodes 12 & 13 Syllables I recommend (I'm always learning & trying to improve!) Beginners - Ti Intermediate - Ti for firmer tonguing, Di for legato Advanced - Ti for firmer, Di for legato, Li for super legato if needed For tonguing, demonstrate well on clarinet or use your primary instrument

#### Mouthpiece only (to fix problems)

Use a visual tuner displayed for students to all see You demonstrate first so they can see and hear an example 1 student plays a whole note then four quarters - should look the same

#### **Baby Registers (to fix problems)**

C slur to G, then tongue quarter notes Use the same exercise with tuner (like above) now on baby registers

# **Scale for styles**

2 octave concert Bb (or others) straight 8ths with quarter at top/last note Slur 2, tongue 2 Play as legato Play as staccato (introduce only after higher notes have good response) Watch for flat chins, statue, picture not a video

# Thirds for styles, endurance, sight-reading & rhythm

- 1. Play straight thirds all tongued legato (vary key signatures as possible)
- 2. Play straight thirds all staccato legato (vary key signatures as possible)
- 3. To progress this, have them double the top note, then bottom, then both

# Assessment of Tonguing

You must hear the students individually to assess tonguing
